**Entrance Antiphon:** The Lord is truly risen, alleluia. To him be glory and power for all the ages of eternity, alleluia, alleluia!

**Responsorial psalm:** This day was made by the Lord; we rejoice and are glad. (Ps 117).

**Gospel Acclamation:** Alleluia, alleluia! Christ, our passover, has been sacrificed; let us celebrate the feast then, in the Lord. Alleluia!

**Communion Antiphon:** Christ our Passover has been sacrificed, alleluia; therefore let us keep the feast with the unleavened bread of purity and truth, alleluia, alleluia.



**And finally- weekly thought from Fr. Paul.**

The sad news of the fire-ravaged Notre Dame Cathedral has touched everyone. It is one of the glories of the mediaeval period, when France, and Europe, was Catholic and Christian. Interestingly, while France declares itself to be a secular country, its most powerful national symbol is still a church. No other building or monument captures the spirit of the nation more than Notre Dame – for believer and unbeliever alike. Not even the Eiffel Tower.

To me, that says something about the power of religion to touch hearts. And one of the most powerful images in the aftermath of the fire was the sight of a large crucifix in the sanctuary, standing tall in the midst of the ashes and still smouldering timbers. And the stone building itself, thank God, still stands, defiantly. As we celebrate Christ's triumph over death at Easter, the tragedy of Notre Dame Cathedral mirrors the tragedy of the Cross, a tragedy that was transformed into triumph on the first Easter Day. We look forward to the triumphal return of Notre Dame Cathedral to its former glory as a symbol of the Resurrection.
