*Our Wee Community: Thanks to Ian and Sean for holding the fort in my absence while in Rome. The trip to Pavia, just south of Milan, to see the tomb of St Augustine was memorable. We also visited the baptismal pool under Milan Cathedral where Augustine was baptised in 387, a special moment. But it was a long trip by coach from Rome. I was with a group of 16 Augustinian friars and sisters from Indonesia, India, China, Nigeria, Kenya, USA, Spain, Hungary and Poland, to whom I gave a week's course at our headquarters in Rome on being Augustinians in our contemporary world - a little hobby horse of mine which keeps me from watching too much television. Rome doesn't change much, except that the beefed-up presence of police, and soldiers in battle dress, was noticeable, and not just in St Peter's Square. I was hoping to bump into Pope Francis, but he was busy. I missed you all, and it's great to be back.*
